



GreenScreen® for Safer Chemicals Profiler Program

The GreenScreen® Profiler Program is a training and credentialing program designed to guide organizations through the process to become a Licensed GreenScreen Profiler. Organizations best suited for the program are consulting firms with expertise in toxicology, chemistry, environmental sciences, ecotoxicology, industrial hygiene, and epidemiology.

Through the Profiler Program, the participating company must demonstrate both organizational capacity and technical expertise in performing GreenScreen assessments that meet the highest level of quality and completeness requirements. Upon successful completion of the program, the organization must sign a License Agreement with Clean Production Action.

Licensed GreenScreen Profiler organizations are licensed to provide third party GreenScreen assessment services for a fee to clients. The assessments generated by a Licensed GreenScreen Profiler organization are Certified GreenScreen assessments. The Licensed GreenScreen Profilers are kept up to date on all method revisions, and Clean Production Action audits their application of the method to ensure that it is being applied as intended.

The Profiler Program includes three key elements:

- 1) Application Process – Submit an application and complete a checklist to demonstrate the organization meets the general and technical competency requirements. The Application must be approved by Clean Production Action to proceed to the next step -- training.
- 2) Profiler Course – Participate in course to ensure technical lead members of the organization clearly understand GreenScreen policy and correct application of the method.
- 3) Profiler Practicum – Approved candidate organizations will demonstrate familiarity with GreenScreen chemical hazard assessment process and method by completing three GreenScreen assessments for chemicals assigned by Clean Production Action. Candidate organizations must submit assessments to Clean Production Action for review and make necessary revisions to accommodate identified non-conformities or observations raised in the review.

Participation:

The number of individuals within the organization that can participate in the Profiler Program varies per element of the program.

Course Descriptions:

GreenScreen Standard Introductory Course (pre-requisite)

Purpose: Understand the value of the GreenScreen methodology and be able to use GreenScreen assessments to support informed material selection decisions.

Delivery Options & Duration:

- Online (asynchronous): Six modules with video length ranging from 40-60 minutes

GreenScreen Profiler Course (required)

Purpose: Understand GreenScreen program policies and chemical hazard assessment approaches specific to the GreenScreen method.

Delivery Options & Duration:

- Live web-based: One-hour session

GreenScreen Advanced Topics Course (optional)

Purpose: Learn how to perform comprehensive, high quality GreenScreen assessments.

Deliver Options & Duration:

- Live web-based: Four months
- Eight 90-minute classes, two 60-minute sessions, homework, and a test
- Frequency of public offering: Once per calendar year
